Mr. Brickey, an engineer, oversaw the design and building of the plant and was there when the first car was driven off the line. He donated some of his personal collection to the Library, even his SATURN jacket and a blueand white flag that had flown over the plant during construction. The colors were later changed to red. Also included in a crystal vase was some of the dirt from the groundbreaking.
